Introduction

Our 3,500-pound capacity Power Tongue Jacks make lifting and lowering a trailer so easy. With just the flip of the switch, the Power Tongue Jack lifts a trailer with ease. Helical cut gears reduce noise and improve operating efficiencies, and four LED lights makes setting up camp simple, day or night.

NOTE: The Power Tongue Jack is for travel trailer applications only.

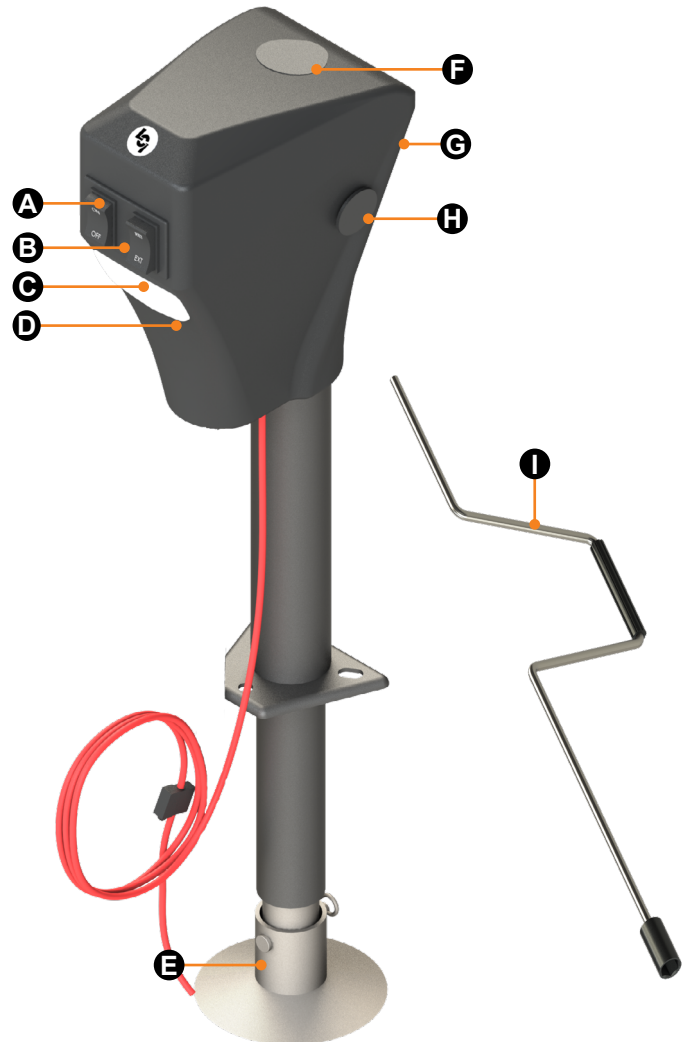

Power Tongue Jack

Prior to Installation

Resources Required

- Cordless or Electric Drill or Screw Gun
- Appropriate Drive Bits
- ½" Socket

Preparation

1. Remove the foot pad from the Power Tongue Jack (if necessary).

A. Remove the hairpin cotter pin (Fig.1D) and clevis pin (Fig.1B) holding the foot pad (Fig.1C) to the jack leg (Fig.1A). Set the pins and the foot pad aside.

2. Support the trailer according to OEM instructions.

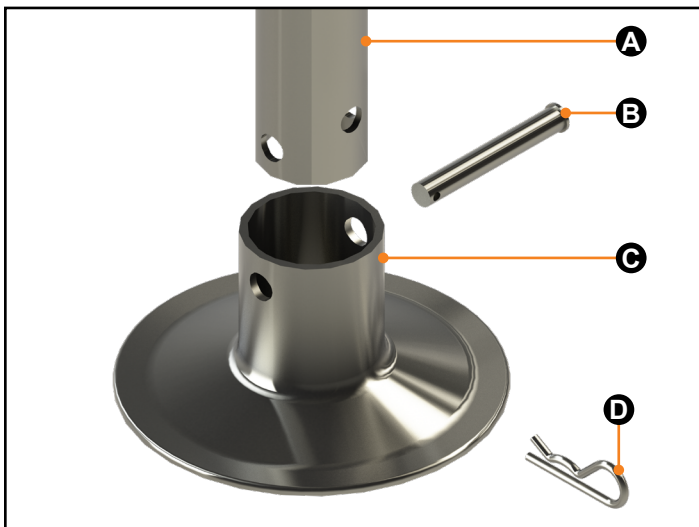

Installation

1. Carefully slide the jack leg (Fig.2A) through the hole in the coupler (Fig.2B) on the trailer A-frame (Fig.2C).

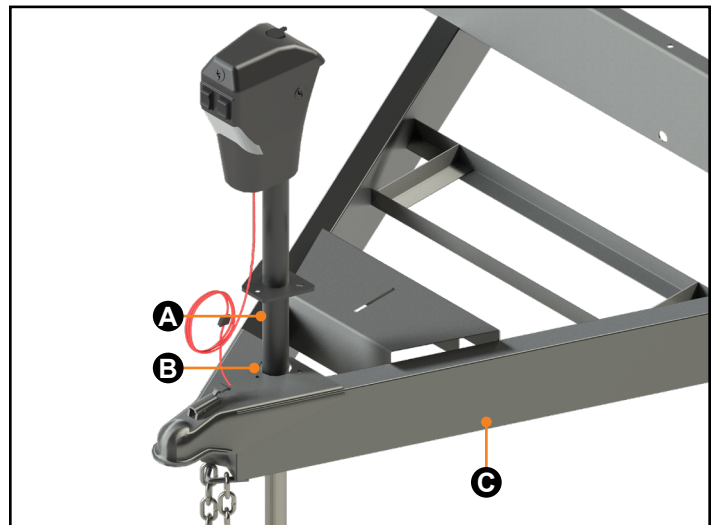

2. Align the three (3) holes in the Power Tongue Jack mounting plate (Fig.3A) with the three (3) holes in the coupler (Fig.3B).

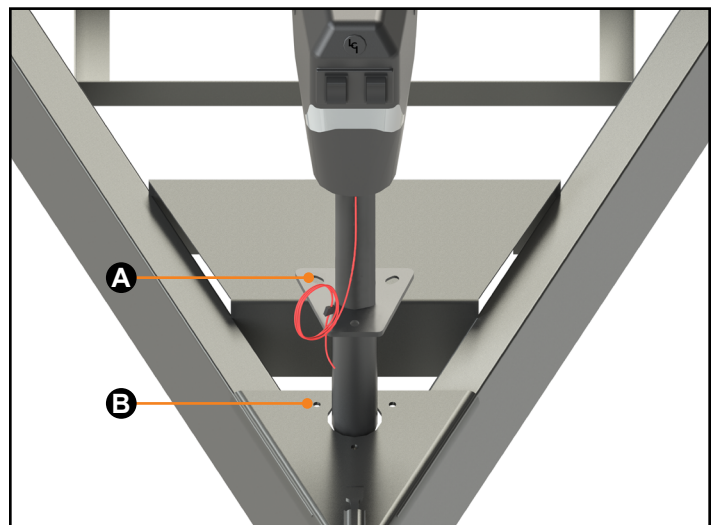

3. Secure the Power Tongue Jack to the coupler plate with the three (3) $\frac{3}{8}$ " bolts provided (**Fig.4B**).

4. Connect the red power wire from the Power Tongue Jack housing (**Fig. 4A**) to a grounded 12V power supply on the trailer.

NOTE: The Power Tongue Jack **MUST** be wired through a 30 amp fused circuit.

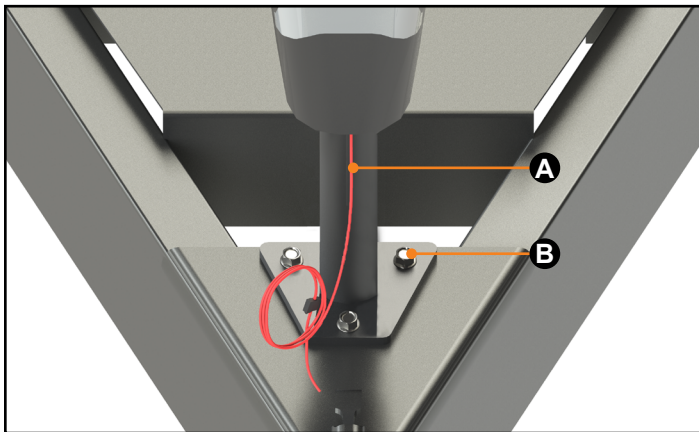

5. Reattach the foot pad (**Fig.5C**) to the jack leg (**Fig.5A**) by sliding the foot pad back over the bottom of the jack leg and securing it with the clevis pin (**Fig.5B**) and hairpin cotter pin (**Fig.5D**).

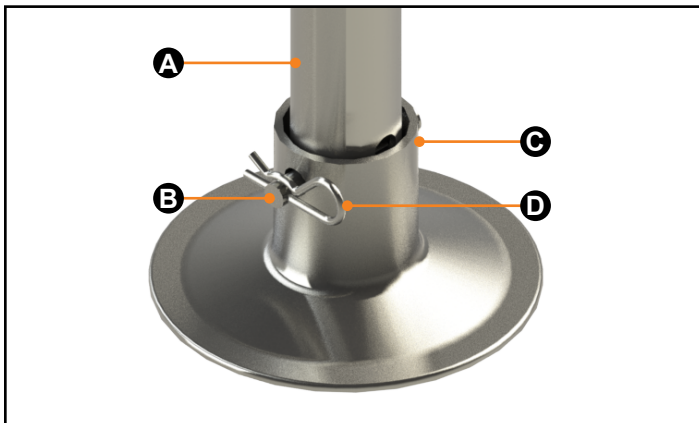

- Never drop the trailer off the hitch ball.
- Never exceed the load capacity.
- Never use the Power Tongue Jack to lift the trailer for service or tire change.
- Never move the trailer before the Power Tongue Jack is fully retracted.
- Never use the Power Tongue Jack unless the foot pad clevis pin is fully inserted through both sides of the jack's inner tube and secured by the hairpin cotter pin.

Operation

NOTE: The “On” and “Off” switch (**Fig.7**) controls the Power Tongue Jack’s light only. If left on for an extended period of time, the light will drain the trailer’s battery.

NOTE: The Power Tongue Jack is designed for vertical movement of the trailer only.

Unhitching from Tow Vehicle

1. Chock the tires of the trailer.
2. Be sure the footpad (**Fig.6B**) of the Power Tongue Jack is pinned securely in place with the clevis pin (**Fig.6A**) and hairpin cotter pin (**Fig.6C**).
3. Make sure the ground surface under the Power Tongue Jack is firm and level.
4. Push “EXT” (**Fig.7B**) to extend the Power Tongue Jack until the footpad touches the ground and the coupler clears the hitch ball.
5. Move the tow vehicle away from the trailer.
6. Push “RET” (**Fig.7A**) as needed to return the front of the trailer to level.

Reconnecting to Tow Vehicle

1. Chock the tires of the trailer.
2. Press “EXT” (**Fig.7B**) if needed to allow the coupler to clear the hitch ball.
3. Push “RET” (**Fig.7A**) to retract the Power Tongue Jack until the coupler properly mounts the hitch ball and the leg of the Power Tongue Jack is fully retracted.

NOTE: Be sure the leg of the Power Tongue Jack (**Fig.6B**) is fully retracted prior to moving the tow vehicle.

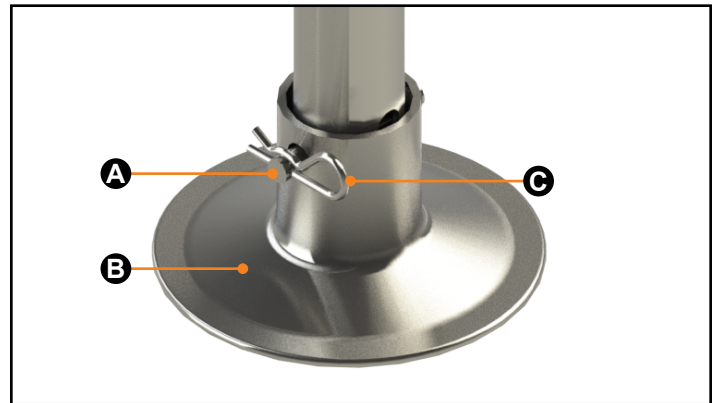

Manual Operation and Troubleshooting

NOTE: If 12VDC power is unavailable to operate the Power Tongue Jack, use the following directions to manually operate the Power Tongue Jack:

Manually Unhitching from Tow Vehicle

1. Chock the tires of the trailer.
2. Be sure the footpad (Fig.8B) of the Power Tongue Jack is pinned securely in place with the clevis pin (Fig.8A) and hairpin cotter pin (Fig.8C).
3. Make sure the ground surface under the Power Tongue Jack is firm and level.
4. Open the rubber plug (Fig.9A) on top of the Power Tongue Jack's gearbox to expose the manual drive shaft.
5. Insert the manual crank handle (Fig.10).
6. Turn the handle clockwise until the trailer is supported and the coupler clears the hitch ball.
7. Move the tow vehicle away from the trailer.
8. Lower the trailer until it is level by turning the crank handle counterclockwise.
9. Remove the crank handle (Fig.10).
10. Replace the rubber plug (Fig.9A).

Manually Reconnecting to Tow Vehicle

1. Chock the tires of the trailer.
2. Be sure the footpad of the Power Tongue Jack is pinned securely with the clevis and hairpin cotter pin (Fig.8A).
3. Open the rubber plug (Fig.9A) on top of the Power Tongue Jack's gearbox to expose the manual drive shaft.
4. Insert the manual crank handle (Fig.10).
5. Turn the crank handle counterclockwise until the coupler properly mounts the hitch ball and the leg of the Power Tongue Jack is fully retracted.

NOTE: The crank handle may need to be initially turned clockwise to extend the jack to clear the hitch ball prior to retracting the jack.

6. Remove the crank handle (Fig.10).

7. Replace the rubber plug (Fig.9A).

NOTE: Be sure the leg of the Power Tongue Jack (Fig.8B) is fully retracted prior to moving the tow vehicle.

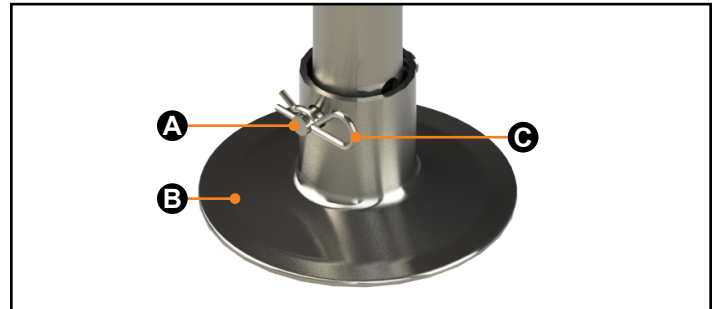

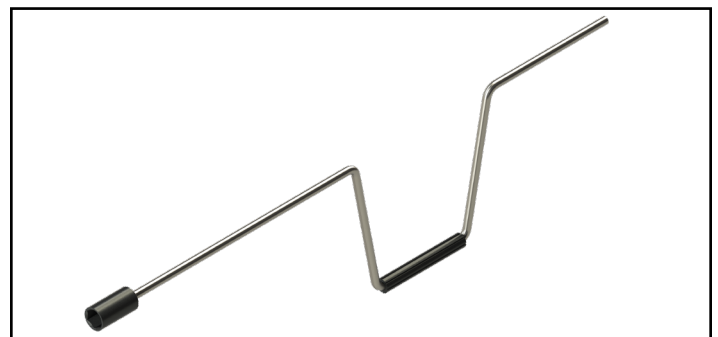
